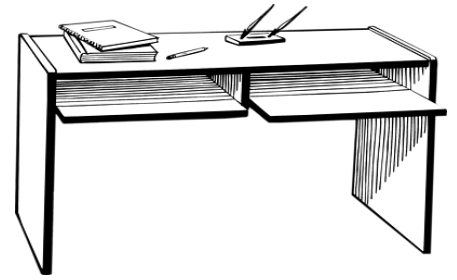

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

## The Word Became Flesh

And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light.  
(Genesis 1:3 NIV).

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God,  
and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning.  
(John 1:1-2 NIV).

Thoughts, words and actions are what make things happen in life -  
physically and spiritually.

When God set out to create the universe He spoke His thoughts out  
as words and actions followed. The universe was created and from  
here we have the earth (Genesis 1:3).

When God wanted to save humanity from the separation and sin He  
sent His Word. The Word became flesh and Christ was born. Christ is  
the revelation of God to mankind (John 1:1-4).

Thoughts are powerful. Thoughts within the mind of human beings can  
almost always create things and have end products. In 2004 mankind  
launched a satellite called Rosetta (about the size of three London  
buses). This satellite carried a sophisticated bit of equipment called  
Philae (about the size of a washing machine). Ten years later, in  
November 2014, after travelling about 3.97 billion miles, Rosetta  
reached a comet known as 67p and dropped Philae on it. An amazing  
feat of science and engineering that all started with a thought.

What thoughts do you allow yourself to meditate on? Our thought can  
bring us closer to God's will for our life or billions of miles away from it.  
Godly thinking gives birth to contentment, peace and wellbeing  
irrespective of what is going on around us. Toxic thoughts however  
lead to stress, depression and plenty of unhappiness. Toxic thoughts  
are the ones that take you away from God's peace. They cause you to

become what God never intended you to be. Toxic thoughts are often the source of tension strife and disharmony.

During this Christmas season we remember the thoughts that God had towards the world.

But the Angel said to them, “Do not be afraid. I bring you **good news** that will cause great joy for all the people. Luke 2:10 (NIV)

To continuously benefit from this ‘good news’ we have to learn how to bring our thought life in line with God’s thoughts.

Let me try and summarise it like this. The way you can avoid toxic thoughts and the damage they will do to your life is by:

1. Recognising that the thoughts you entertain will have an effect on you - for good or bad. Thoughts create things.  
**Knowing that the thoughts we entertain have an impact on our life is the beginning of Godly thinking.**

2. Ponder the thoughts that come to your mind before chewing on them. Consider where these thoughts will take you. Are you on the way to a comet of bitterness and anger? If so, choose something else to think on? Consider who you are in Christ Jesus? Recall the joy and peace you are missing by dwelling on toxic thoughts. Ask God to give you the strength to dwell on something else. For more on ‘who’ you are in Christ listen to the message online:

Finally remember the counsel that comes from scripture...

In conclusion, my brothers and sisters, fill your minds with those things that are good and that deserve praise: things that are true, noble, right, pure, lovely, and honourable. Put into practice what you learnt and received from me, both from my words and from my actions. And the God who gives us peace will be with you.

# NEWS FROM CORNWALL

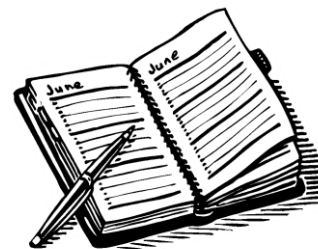

Prior to the morning service tomorrow we shall meet around the war memorial in the grounds along with representatives of many organisations to remember those who lost their lives in two world wars and subsequent conflicts. Laurence Binyon [1869-1943] wrote a seven verse poem *The Fallen*. One verse ended with 'We shall remember them'. Every Wednesday morning at 9.30am a Communion Service is held. In the middle of the week I find this very helpful as we all do this as the Lord said 'In remembrance of me'.

On Monday the funeral service will take place of one of our members Max Hocking a Cornish farmer and a local preacher now retired and until prevented by ill health a regular at our weekly 'Thought for Today' meeting. I spoke at the funeral of his sister when he said to me 'One never knows who will be next but it doesn't really matter when you know where you are going'. How true. Since I joined the T for T Meeting soon after arriving, Cornwall Max has joined six others from that group. The story goes that a parcel was returned to the Post Office marked 'Deceased, address unknown'. I know many Christians who have no doubts as to where they are going.

Next week at 6.30pm thousands will be in Truro to celebrate City of Light. As well as the Christmas lights being switched on there will be a very long parade of school children, community groups, colleges etc carrying home and professionally made lanterns of all shapes and sizes and of course several bands. In the midst of all the celebrations there will be sadness. For instance for the family of the man who was killed in a car crash on the very day he received news that he was clear from cancer. Or the teenage son of one of three adults who died trying to help young surfers in the water a few miles from Newquay. There was no lifeguard cover as the RNLI patrols May to September only. On the other hand we must never forget the tremendous work the RNLI do night and day around the coasts in all weathers. I take this opportunity of wishing all readers near and far, known to me or not, a very happy and peaceful Christmas as we celebrate together the birth of Jesus Christ our Saviour. A Prayer: God of glory, strengthen us in our life together that we may grow in love for you and each other. Amen

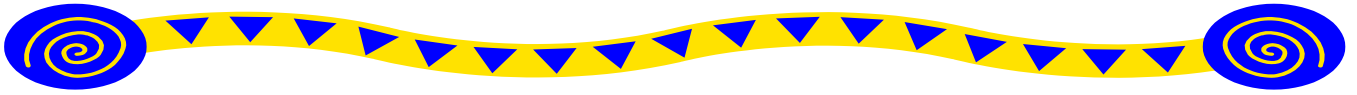
The cost is £95 per person, if paid in full by the 18th of January 2015. If the remainder is paid after the 18th of January it will cost £115.

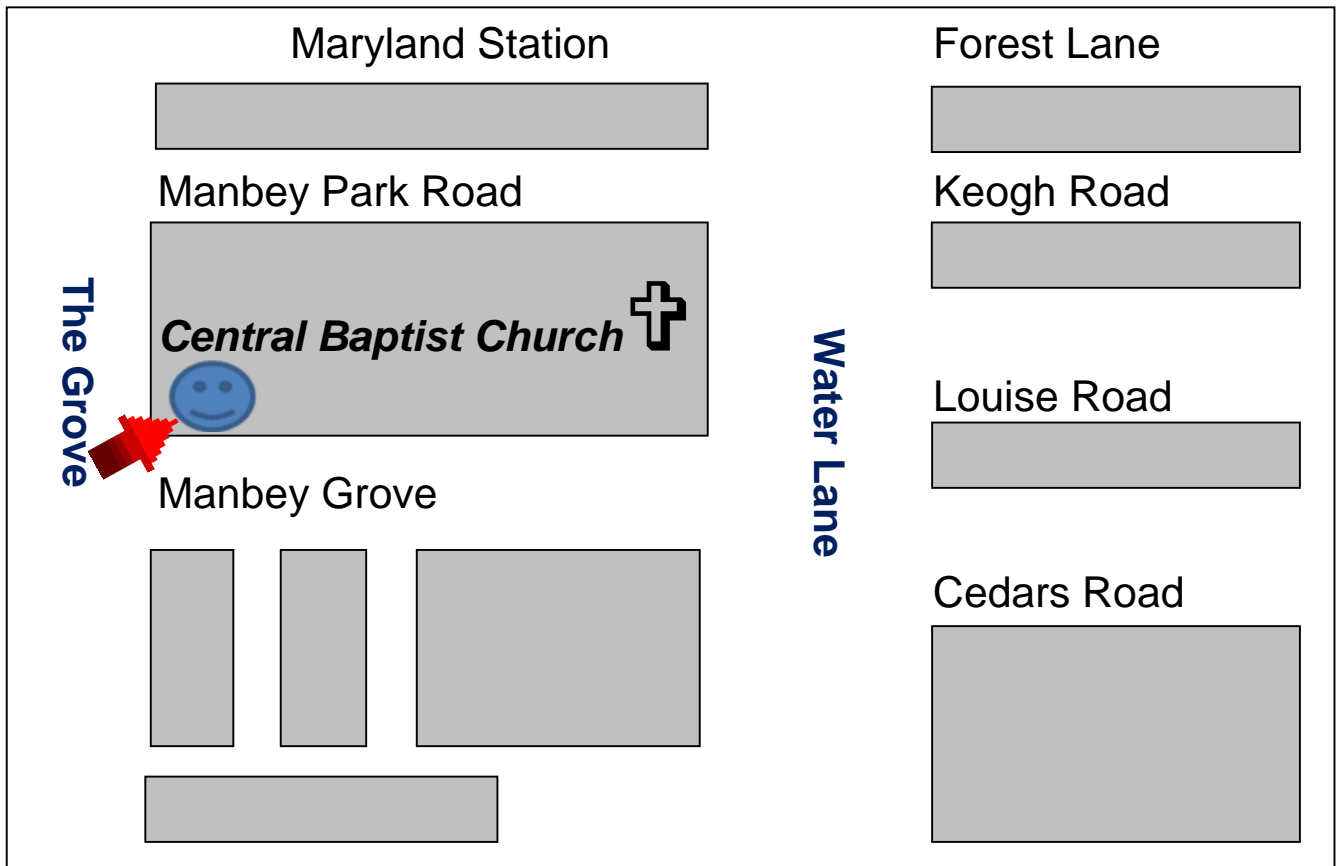

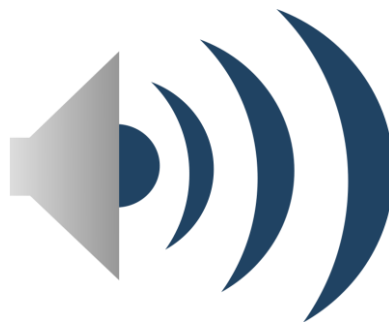
