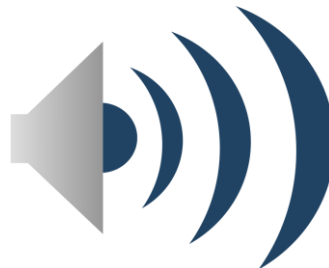

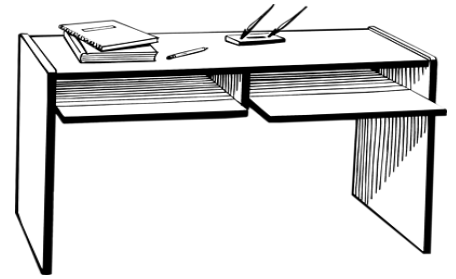

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

## The Church – The Body of Christ

Jesus first made mention of the Church in Matthew 16:13-18.

13 When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, “Who do people say the Son of Man is?”

14 They replied, “Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets.”

15 “But what about you?” he asked. “Who do you say I am?”

16 Simon Peter answered, “You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.”

17 Jesus replied, “Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven. 18 And I tell you that you are Peter, and **on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it.** Matthew 16:13-18 (NIV)

The Church is not a building nor is it limited to any particular denomination. Rather the English word *Church* comes from the Greek word *ekklesia* which means ‘a called out body of people’.

The Church of God is made up of people that have responded personally to the call of God.

When mankind walked away from God in disobedience in the Garden of Eden, God called out to them yet they ran and hid (Genesis 3: 6-8). God wanted back the personal relationship He had made mankind to have with Him. Yet our disobedience and insistence of doing things our way and without Him is the sin that denies us the personal relationship we should have with our heavenly Father.

Holding on to customs, rituals and guidelines can make us religious but not righteous. To be righteous we have to be *right with God* and only Jesus Christ can accomplish that for us.

Ever since mankind walked away from God, the human race has got further and further away from her creator.

God called a man known as Abram and promised to make him and his descendants the people of God (Genesis 12:1-3). These people later became known as Israel and God also changed Abram's name to Abraham. Jesus has come to extend this invitation to all people and this is what is known as the Church. Those who are not Israelites are often called Gentiles in the Bible. The book of Galatians puts it this way.

7 Understand, then, that those who have faith are children of Abraham.

8 Scripture foresaw that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, and announced the gospel in advance to Abraham: 'All nations will be blessed through you.'

**9 So those who rely on faith are blessed along with Abraham, the man of faith.** Galatians 3:7-9 (NIV)

The truth is, when God called Abraham, he was giving him and the children of Israel an advance invitation to the gospel.

Jesus Christ has called us to come and take part in the blessing of a restored relationship with Him. This is brought about by the work of the Holy Spirit as can be seen on the day of Pentecost (Acts 1). Galatians summarises all this for us quite neatly

14 He (Jesus) redeemed us in order that the blessing given to Abraham might come to the Gentiles through Christ Jesus, so that by faith we might receive the promise of the Spirit. Galatians 3:14 (NIV)

The Church, the body of Christ, is comprised of those who have willingly and consciously accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord and saviour. They have a personal relationship with God through Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit.

## NEWS FROM CORNWALL

Did you hear or see on TV or in the newspapers last month that UK's largest ever mechanical puppet was seen in Cornwall? It was three times taller than a double decker bus, part man and part steam machine. It was due to make an appearance at a disused mining site just outside St. Agnes this morning but this is unlikely to have happened due to the inclement weather. This major feat of Cornish engineering set off from Tavistock in Devon a fortnight ago to mark the 10th anniversary of the Cornwall and West Devon Landscape being added to the UNESCO list of World Heritage Sites. I am reminded of a man who was nearly 10ft tall who was challenged and defeated by a young boy. Do you know their names?

Last month a 40ft sperm whale became stranded on the beach in Perranporth but unfortunately could not be saved. That reminds me of someone who was swallowed by a great fish and survived. 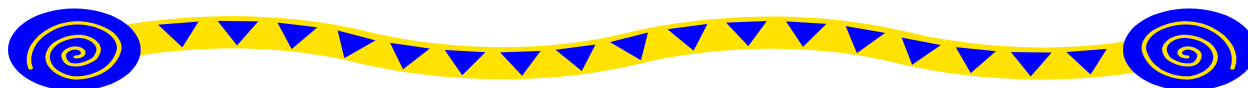

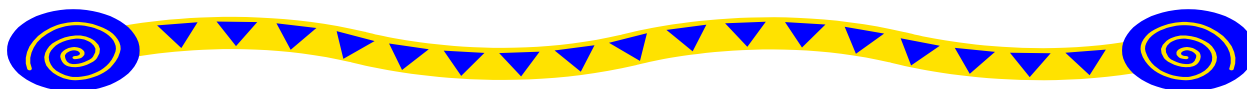
